



Players' Code of Conduct

- Behave in a sporting manner at all times to all players, officials and spectators and accept responsibility for all actions taken while on the trip or event.
- Don't make detrimental statements in respect of the performance of any match officials or umpires and play by the rules.
- Do not engage in inappropriate and/or physical contact with players or officials during the course of play.
- Outside guests are not permitted into the accommodation precinct unless prior approval has been given by the coach and manager. Supervision by an adult must be maintained at all times.
- Do not try to achieve a contrived outcome to a match or competition, or otherwise improperly influence the outcome or any other aspect of a match or a competition.
- Adhere to Carmel College Safety and Health and EOTC Policies at all times.
- Refrain from using obscene, offensive or insulting language and/or making obscene gestures which may insult other players, officials or spectators.
- Accept responsibility for all appropriate actions taken.
- Exercise reasonable care to prevent injury by ensuring that you play within the rules. Reasonable care consists of showing due diligence in abiding by the rules and adhering to the official's decisions.
- Be a positive role model for your teammates and lead by example so you can maximize this opportunity to represent the school.



BEHAVIOUR CODE

GENERAL

School trips are designed to give students a rewarding, enjoyable and educational experience. They do, however, involve issues and risks which do not occur in ordinary day to day classroom situations. Members of staff willingly accept the added responsibility such trips bring. Therefore, we expect students to contribute to the success of school trips by co-operating fully with supervising adults and by acting in a responsible manner so that the trip is not only enjoyable but it is also a good public relations exercise for the school.

As this is a school trip, normal school rules apply. At all times, students are under the control of the members of staff and must comply with the following rules laid down for the trip and with any instructions given during the trip.

Smoking, drugs and alcohol are not permitted.

All curfews must be observed, including technology curfews

PROPERTY

Students will be responsible for their own belongings including personal valuables and money.

The school cannot accept responsibility for the consequences to any student resulting from or occurring during any breach of the rules laid down for the trip or any breach of instructions during the trip.

Failure to follow the code will result in the student being returned to school immediately at the parent's' expense. No refund will be available.
