First Aid Room

The First Aid Room is open from 9.30am- 2.30pm and is staffed by our Health and Attendance Coordinator, Mrs Yvette Smith.

Support will continue outside core hours when needed, and staff will respond promptly to urgent health issues. Families are reminded to keep unwell students at home to aid recovery and prevent spreading illness. If a student becomes unwell at school, she must report to the First Aid room, and staff will contact you if collection is necessary.

We do not provide any strapping tape for pre-existing injuries. For any new or pre-existing sporting injuries your daughter might have, we highly recommend **Dynamic Physio**. They're conveniently located across the road at 215 Shakespeare Road and have already been collaborating with our Seniors teams this year.

Measles cases in Aotearoa (Information from the Ministry of Education)

Recent measles cases linked to overseas travel have been reported in Te Tai Tokerau and Queenstown. Cases were active in the community while infectious and there is a risk of measles circulating there, and more widely in Aotearoa.

Points to share with parents, caregivers and the school community:

- Measles is very contagious and can make people of any age very sick.
- Watch for measles symptoms fever, cough, runny nose, sore eyes and a blotchy rash.

• If anyone in your whānau has measles symptoms keep them home and contact a doctor or Healthline urgently on 0800 611 116.

• Vaccination is the best protection from measles. Check all whānau are immunised.

<u>Measles immunity – Health New Zealand</u> Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine – Health New Zealand

 Anyone closely exposed to measles who has not received two MMR vaccinations cannot attend their school | kura for at least eight days.

Reports

At the end of term 3 Progress Reports for all students were sent out and made available on the Kamar Portal. These reports are a continuation from the term 1 and 2 reports, and you will receive one further report at the end of term 4. The report has been designed to indicate where your daughter is at with regard to organisation, academic engagement and attitude to learning.

For students in Year 7-11, assessment information that is available at the time of these reports being produced has been recorded in the report.

For students in Year 12-13 there are further sections that contain your daughter's NCEA summary to date, the results from the recent practice examinations and a table of the confirmed NCEA internal assessment results- those that have been marked, moderated, and finalised.

Additionally, for all students in Year 7-13 the report includes a breakdown of your daughter's attendance by subject, and there is a further summary section of her participation in activities and groups to date for 2025.

If you have any questions or concerns at any time, please contact your daughter's teachers or her Dean.

Cellphones

We would like to remind you about our Carmel College phone usage rules:

- Student's phones are to be in their bags, silent and not used at school, until after 3.15pm.
- Students are not to use their phones during class time. This includes during Atawhai, morning tea and lunchtime.
- 'Phones are not to be seen until 3.15'

If you need to contact your daughter during the school day, you can either email them using your daughter's school email address or leave a message at Reception to be delivered.

Uniform requirements and information

While most of our students wear the uniform proudly, we have noticed an increase in jewellery, in particular multiple earrings, rings and bracelets. We have also noticed that some skirts are getting very short. Please note the following:

- The compulsory uniform items for all students are: blazer, skirt, cardigan, shirt and black leather lace-up shoes, black crew length socks and black opaque tights for formal occasions.
- Carmel PE top/shorts/leggings are also compulsory for students in Years 7-10.
- All students' hair should have a clean, tidy, natural appearance. Hair longer than collar length needs to be tied up.
- Jewellery one plain stud or sleeper earring in each lower lobe, cross or pounamu pendant worn under the blouse.
- All school uniform items can be purchased from our supplier, NZ Uniforms which is located at 19A Douglas Alexander Parade, Rosedale.

A Restorative Approach

Carmel College is a Restorative, PB4L school. We focus on repairing harm, understanding perspectives, restoring relationships, and encouraging students to take responsibility. This approach reflects our Catholic and Mercy values, fostering a culture of compassion, dignity, and respect. We appreciate your support in maintaining a positive and inclusive environment.

Attendance

The Government regular attendance target is that 80% of students will be present for more than 90% of the Term by 2030.


As a result of this target, attendance data for each school is being collected by the Ministry of Education. Four 'Student Attendance Categories' have been developed which are reported back to individual schools termly to provide a snapshot of how the school is performing in reaching this target.


Below are the four 'Student Attendance Categories'

Student Categories	Student with	Equivalent to
Regular attendance	over 90% attendance	missing fewer than 5 days across a term
Irregular absence	more than 80% and up to 90% attendance	absent for between 5 and 9 days across a term
Moderate absence	more than 70% and up to 80% attendance	absent for between 10 and 14.5 days across a term
Chronic absence	70% attendance or less	absent for 15 days or more across a school term

Whilst our school attendance as a whole is **above 90% on a weekly basis**, the Government target, and the reports that are being provided, drill down into individual student's attendance, so that schools can understand how frequently each student attends.

Below is our student attendance data snapshot for Terms 1-3.





Regular attendance is closely linked to student success. Carmel College will continue reviewing attendance procedures, and if a student's attendance falls below 80%, her dean will contact you, and external support may be sought if needed.

Student Absences, Late Arrivals, Early Departures, Appointments during the school day

All absences, including late arrivals and early departures, must be logged in advance via SchoolBridge. Students must sign in/out at reception, and cannot leave without prior notification. Accurate records help keep students safe. If a student becomes unwell at school, she must go to the First Aid room, and staff will contact you if collection is needed.
